Scenario:

Patient in cubicle, brought in by AV post collapse at home, ?LOC, large laceration to L arm, ATS cat 3. Ambulance have taken vital signs, put on a cervical collar, administered Penthrane 3mls, commenced an IV infusion, administered 400mls N/Saline and bandaged L elbow.

1. Log on to FirstNet, Check In for shift, and Assign self to patient
2. Review Triage note in Patient Summary
3. Document handover from AV – c-collar insitu, penthrane 3mls, IVB – IV fluid 400mls, bandage to elbow, agreed time of handover (VEMD)
4. Review activities - Document ED Assessment Adult (initial nursing assessment) including primary/secondary survey/ECG taken/vital signs
5. Review allergies - enter a milk allergy, moderate severity, reaction rash/itchiness
6. Review alerts and add a clinical or safety alert
7. Place a 'nil orally' and 'no visitors' EVENT on the patient
8. Document insert IVC and Removal of AV IVC (see activity on Launchpoint)
9. Document a Nurse Initiated Pathology order using the Collapse Pathology Set
10. Review activity column: use specimen collection module to collect specimen (not able to scan ; not able to print labels)

11. MAR – review medication record and commence from MAW -IV Saline infusion, Cefazolin, Tetanus and IV bolus order
12. Order Nurse Initiated paracetamol 1g from Quick Orders and administer via MAW
14. Document insertion and care of IDC, urine output (150 mls), and a FWT
15. Adjust rate on IV therapy to 125mls per hour
16. Navigate to ED Skin Injury in iView –document wound assessment large deep wound with tendon on view
17. Document Vital Signs using the Observation Chart
18. Review pathology results
19. Review order and document Blood Administration in iView (witness TRAINED30, password cerner)
20. Complete the pre-op procedure checklist
21. Order and document the application of restraints under a Duty Of Care
22. Patient to be admitted to ward – navigate to Discharge Process and document Timeout
23. Document verbal handover given to ward
